For the 18th Year in a Row CAADC Provides Free Tax Assistance

Community Action Agency of Delaware County, Inc. will again be providing free tax assistance to eligible Delaware County residents through Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) sites. VITA sites aim to serve families that qualify for the Earned Income Tax Credit and Child Tax Credit. CAADC has provided free tax assistance for the last 18 years including helping 952 households last year. All volunteer preparers complete an IRS certification. CAADC will be providing assistance in Boothwyn, Darby, Chester and Upper Darby through mid-April.

CAADC received a grant from the **Delaware County Interactive Gaming Revenue Authority** and **Delaware County Council** to support the VITA sites.

Recent Development Activity

CAADC has been fortunate to receive the following private contributions from the community during the last quarter: Quest for the Best supported the Wesley House Shelter with a donation of \$1,000. The Justamere Foundation supported our After School Program with a grant of \$50,000. Delaware County Medical Society Public Health Fund donated \$1,250 to the Agency for our support of low-income families. Charities Aid Foundation of America donated \$437 to CAADC. The Delaware County Interactive Gaming Revenue Authority provided a grant of \$25,228 for our tax assistance sites. The City of Chester Giving Circle provided donations of \$9,000 for Rental Assistance and \$3,000 for the Wesley House Shelter. Congregation Ohev Shalom supported shelter children with a donation of \$1,050. Boeing Employees/Match donated \$2,506 to CAADC.
